



MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING



BETWEEN

**YEOSUSAMIL MIDDLE SCHOOL
OF JEOLLANAM-DO, REPUBLIC OF KOREA**

AND

**YAKUTSK MUNICIPAL LYCEUM
OF YAKUTSK, SAKHA REPUBLIC (YAKUTIA), RUSSIAN FEDERATION**

This Memorandum of Understanding recognizes the intention of Yeosusamil middle school of Jeollanam-do, Republic of Korea and Yakutsk Municipal Lyceum of Sakha Republic, Russian Federation to establish a collaborative agreement and to work together to their mutual benefit of both institutions, stakeholders, and for their students, teachers, staff, and communities they serve.

The two schools recognize that collaborative efforts will be of mutual benefit and will contribute to an enduring institutional linkage for education co-operation and assistance.

A. PURPOSE

Yeosusamil middle school of Jeollanam-do, Republic of Korea and Yakutsk Municipal Lyceum of Sakha Republic, Russian Federation will make an endless effort to promote exchanges in the field of education, culture, art, science, language, and school management in order to broaden the students', teachers' and stakeholders' points of view toward the world and to improve the friendly relationship between the two schools.

B. CONTENT & ACTIVITIES

The two schools agree to be bound by these following clauses:

Clause 1.

The Goal of this agreement is to give the comfort and easiness to the two schools to improve the cooperation in the fields of education, culture, art, science, Languages, etc.; and to improve the knowledge of students, teachers, and stakeholders in the fields and related activities.

Clause 2.

To reach the goal, the two schools will try their best like this.

- a. Teachers, students, and stakeholders exchange teaching and learning materials, all kinds of sharable software, courseware, document, process, and their results of the joint projects.
- a. The two schools agree to visit each other to conduct offline collaborative project related to the goal, to improve the friendly relationship, and to understand more about cultures, the educational systems, and the languages. The number of participants who conduct this visit depends on the situation of each school. The detailed requirements for each reciprocal visit as well as the itinerary will be decided in consultation between the two schools. The two schools wish to have better chances to understand each other, and the possible differences for each visit may be accepted.

Clause 3.

The two schools will do collaborative projects as a part of cooperation to minimize digital divide. The cooperation will cover activities concerning projects including science and technology, culture, language and human interests.

C. FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENT

Clause 4:

The host school will provide all the conveniences, including the educational programs and amenities . The details of the financial arrangement must be discussed and agreed in advance deeply prior to the activity conducted.

D. DURATION

Clause 5.


This Memorandum of Understanding will commence on the date of signing and operate for a period of five years, at which time both schools will by mutual agreement determine the terms and conditions of any extensions of the Memorandum. Both schools shall abide by the Laws and Regulations of their respective countries and institutions particularly those concerning intellectual property rights. The two schools may, by mutual consent, and, amend, modify, or delete any words, phrases, sentences or articles of this MOU.

Should specific joint activities arise as a result of further discussions; details will be set forth in an Agreement, to be signed at the appropriate time by the Principle of both schools.

This MOU is prepared in English language, two identical copies, one for each school. All identical versions are the same and equally valid.



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
